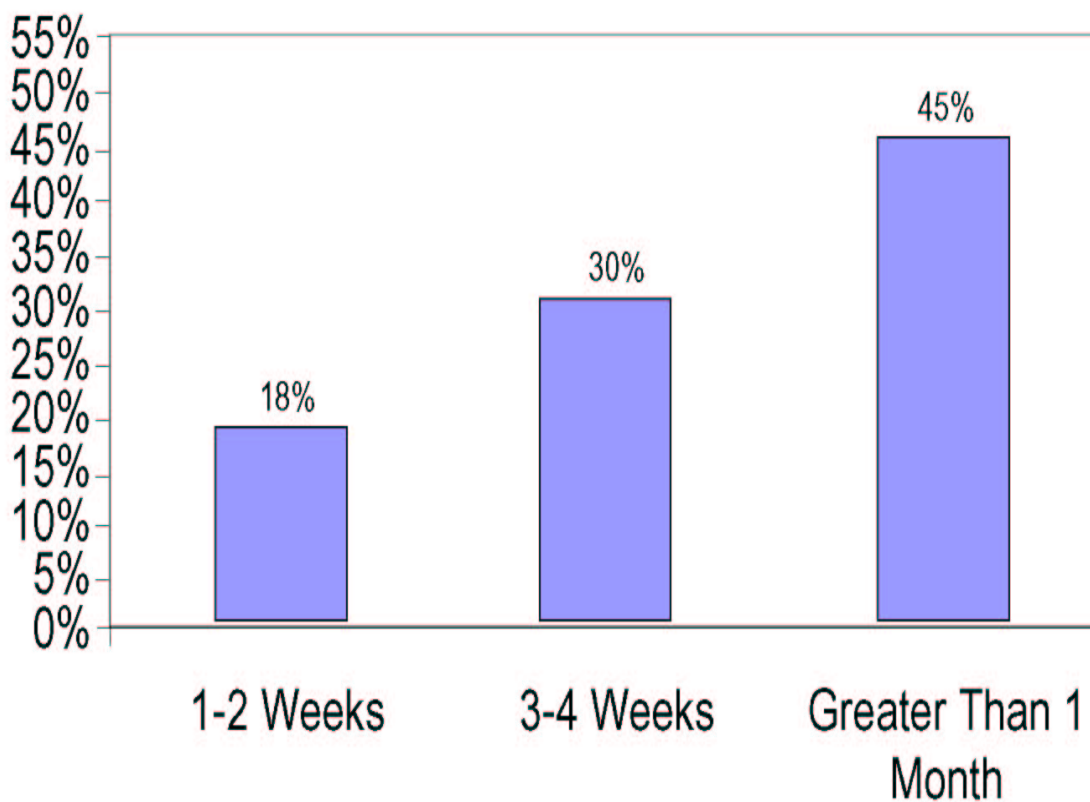


Things you can do...

- SAFETY - An employer can never provide too much training to prevent injuries.
- ENFORCE SAFETY RULES in all departments.
- IMMEDIATE MEDICAL TREATMENT – When an injury is reported, assist the worker in obtaining medical treatment “Immediately” .
- REPORT THE INJURY – Submit the claim to CBR the ***same day*** as the injury .
- INFORM THE WORKER- The worker will have no co-pays or need to pay for workers’ compensation related treatment, tests, or prescriptions.
 - It is the responsibility of the worker to timely report an injury to their supervisor. The worker also needs to present their “return-to-work” form from the doctor so the school can be informed of any restrictions.
 - Advise the injured worker that he/she will have no co-pays or need to pay for workers’ compensation related treatment, tests, or prescriptions.

Report **EVERY** Claim

It is in the OSAG member's best interest to turn in All claims. Paying any claim from the General Fund does not make sense. Your district already paid premium covering these expenses.

Additionally, CBR reduces medical provider bills an average of 60%.

Turn in ALL claims and let your OSAG adjuster take care of the them.
